CASE STUDIES

Instructions: Answer the questions below on the basis of the data provided in the background information.

Background information:

Eva is 24 years old Polish woman who moved to the UK 2 years ago. She works as a cleaner with an annual income of about £18,000. Her English is very limited. The agency that hires her is run by Polish people, so she does not have much of an interaction with Brits. Her social life is limited to several acquaintances with Polish people in Ealing, London. She, however, has a boyfriend and has sexual contacts with him. Eva has used drugs (injection use) back home in Gdansk and does not use condoms when having sex with the boyfriend as according to her they are in a “stable, closed” relationship. Generally, healthwise she feels OK and goes to work regularly.

In the meantime, she did not have any sex with the boyfriend and the relationship deteriorated.

The GP prescribed treatment and suggested an HIV test after realising that the treatment does not bring any effect. The result of the test came back positive. Eva is registered with the local HIV clinic, from where they refer her to you for counselling.
